Marfan syndrome is an inherited (genetic) disorder that affects the body's connective tissue. The disorder can affect the heart, blood vessels, bones, eyes and/or lungs.

- Tall and slender
- Arms, legs, fingers and toes that seem disproportionately long
- Flat feet
- Highly arched palate and crowded teeth
- Joints that are too flexible
- Learning disability
- Nearsightedness
- Small lower jaw (micrognathia)
- Spine that curves to one side (scoliosis)
- Thin, narrow face
- Chest that sinks in - funnel chest, or sticks out - pigeon chest
- Heart palpitations
- Hernias
- Hunched back (kyphosis)
- Stretch marks, not from pregnancy or obesity
- Deviated septum
- GERD – gastro esophageal reflux disease
- Degenerative disk disease
- Leaky heart valve
- Mitral valve prolapse
- Long thin fingers
